Professor Peter Rowe teaches at the Law School, Lancaster University and was formerly Head of the Department of Law at the University of Liverpool from 1988-93. His recent book "The Impact of Human Rights Law on Armed Forces" (2006, Cambridge University Press) follows others studying the subject of his lecture.
